Library District Hires Lee Strehlow as Human Resources Director

VANCOUVER, Wash. -- Fort Vancouver Regional Library District has hired Lee Strehlow as its new Human Resources Director. Strehlow takes on a leadership position at the district as one of six administrative team members, reporting to Executive Director Nancy Tessman.

Strehlow previously was human resources and office services director for the State of Washington's Department of Retirement Systems, beginning at that agency in 2007. Prior to that position, she was director of human resources at the State of Washington's Military Department, and human resource manager at the Washington State departments of Labor and Industries, and Corrections.

Strehlow earned a master's degree in human resources development from Webster University at Fairchild Air Force Base in Spokane. She completed her bachelor's degree in English and technical writing at Eastern Washington University.

In her new library role, Strehlow oversees a department staff of four at library headquarters in Vancouver, and will provide human resources support for a total district staff of about 250 full- and part-time employees in four counties.
