

Thank You for Shaping Our Story 75 Years of FVRL

For 75 years, Fort Vancouver Regional Libraries (FVRLibraries) has been woven into the fabric of our communities. The libraries we love today are a reflection of the people, stories, and shared vision that have shaped them.

It all began with a community vision. In 1891, the Women's Christian Temperance Union petitioned the City of Vancouver to fund a public library, ensuring everyone had access to knowledge.

In Ridgefield, the Priscilla Study Club transformed a small study group into a library that served generations. And in Stevenson, the Women's Club built a space for connection and learning that became a cornerstone of the town.

These grassroots efforts paved the way for the formation of FVRLibraries in 1950, uniting libraries across the region into one system. Since then, the library has grown alongside its communities.

The first bookmobile hit the road in 1941, bringing books to rural schools and families.

Volunteers formed a "book brigade" to move books to the new Ridgefield Library in 2021.

And year after year, local advocates have worked to expand resources, ensuring libraries serve as spaces for learning, exploration, and creativity.

Libraries don't just serve communities—they are shaped by them. Every library, from Vancouver's historic Carnegie building to Yacolt's Bigfoot Book Store managed by the local Friends of the Library group, carries the spirit of the people who built, used, and sustained it.

Whether it's a child discovering a love of reading at storytime or a family borrowing games for a weekend together, each interaction adds a chapter to the library's story.

As we celebrate FVRLibraries' 75th anniversary, we honor the communities that have made this milestone possible. This is your library system, built by your vision, and together, we'll continue creating spaces where everyone belongs.
