Dear Library Patrons,



# Yacolt Library Express:

## Small library, big impact!

If you haven't visited Yacolt Library Express, it's best described as having a small town charm with some pretty unique features for a library. Housed in the 100+ year-old red brick former Town Hall building, it comes with three jail cells. Apparently in the early 20th Century, saloons in Yacolt outnumbered any other type of building by 7-to-1, and the cells were mostly used for "sleeping it off." Today, one cell is a library teen room, another houses Bigfoot Books, the Friends of Yacolt Library Express Bookstore, and the final one is used for storage.

Yacolt Library Express opened in 2012 with an innovative model of self-service. The library is open seven days per week. Staff is present for all or part of four days. During the remaining hours, patrons can enter the building using their library card or number. This library may be small, but the community loves and uses it!

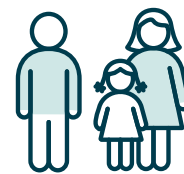

Your library isn't just a place—it's a resource that's already yours. From free access to movies and audiobooks to workshops and quiet workspaces, FVRLibraries helps you learn, create, and connect—without the cost. So before you subscribe, rent, or pay out of pocket, check to see if your library already has what you need—you might be surprised by what's waiting for you.

### 1. SUPPLEMENT YOUR STREAMING *and Cut Costs!*



Ever feel like every new show you want to watch is on a different streaming service? Many people cycle through subscriptions, switching when a new show drops. Instead of juggling multiple paid services, use Kanopy and Hoopla to fill the gaps for free with critically acclaimed films, must-watch documentaries, and more—all without another monthly fee.

### 2. SKIP THE AUDIOBOOK SUBSCRIPTION



If you love audiobooks, you know they can be pricey—\$20+ per title or \$15/month for a subscription. With your library card, you can borrow audiobooks just like regular books. Whether you prefer thrillers, self-improvement, or cozy mysteries, there's always something new to enjoy.

### 3. GET NEWS & MAGAZINES *without the Paywalls*



A full-price digital newspaper subscription can set you back \$150–\$250 per year, and print magazines only add to the expense. PressReader gives you unlimited access to *The New York Times*, *The Economist*, *Good Housekeeping*, *National Geographic*, and more—all available with your library card.

### 4. GET FREE ONE-ON-ONE TUTORING *with Brainfuse*



Private tutoring can cost \$40–\$100 per hour, and even online homework help services often require a subscription. With Brainfuse HelpNow, your library card gives you free access to live tutors, writing feedback, and test prep tools—whether mastering a subject, prepping for an exam, or just needing a second set of eyes on an essay.

## 5. TAKE ONLINE COURSES



### *Without the Price Tag*

If you're looking to build new skills or advance your career, online courses can get expensive. Many platforms charge \$30–\$50 per class, but your library card gives you free access to LinkedIn Learning, offering courses in business, design, tech, and more. Whether you want to level up professionally, explore a new hobby, or learn just for fun, you can study at your own pace—without the price tag.

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## 6. PREFER HANDS-ON LEARNING?

### *Attend Free Events & Workshops*

Not everyone learns best online. If you prefer hands-on experiences or social learning, FVRLibraries offers workshops, clubs, and interactive programs for all ages. Instead of paying \$15 for a craft class or \$50 for a writing workshop, you can crochet a purse, build a mini robot, or get expert gardening tips from Master Gardeners—at no charge.

There's also plenty for writers, gamers, and families—join a writer's group, poetry workshop, or tabletop RPG club, or bring the kids to STEM Lab and Kids Read to a Dog.



## 7. WORK & STUDY in a Cozy, Quiet Space

Buying coffee every time you need Wi-Fi? That adds up fast! Instead, use the library's free high-speed internet, quiet study areas, and comfortable workspaces—some even have spots to eat and drink. Whether you're tackling a big project, working remotely, or just need a distraction-free place to focus, the library is the perfect spot.



## 8. PRINT WHAT YOU NEED—

### *Without the Ink Hassle*

Running out of printer ink at home can be frustrating—and expensive. Instead of paying for cartridges, use FVRLibraries' affordable printing services. Your library card includes a \$3.00 weekly printing credit, covering up to 30 free black & white pages or six free color pages. Need more? Black & white prints cost just \$0.10 per page, and color prints start at \$0.50 per page.

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## WHAT'S THE CATCH? (Not Much!)

Occasionally, a popular book might have a waitlist, or specific resources may have limited availability. But rest assured, many others are ready when you are. And if you do have to wait, library staff can help you find something just as engaging in the meantime—connecting you with hidden gems you might not have discovered on your own. Either way, your library card gives you access to more than you might expect—without extra costs or commitments. Because in the end, it's not just about saving money—it's about making the most of what's already yours.

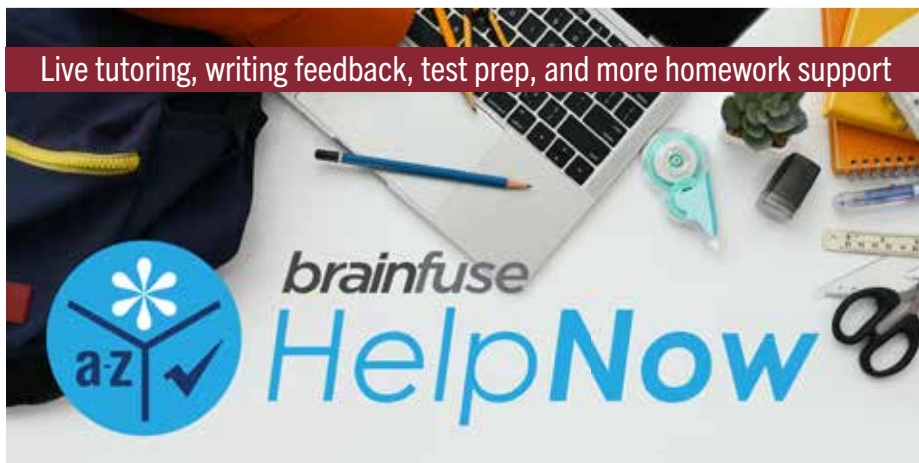

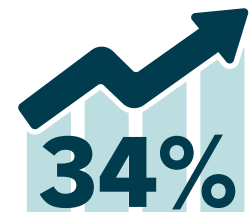

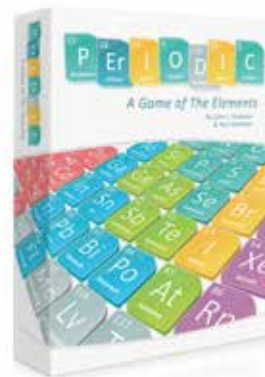
